## COMFORTABLE ACCOMMODATIONS

### CHALETS



Nestled in the tall pines by Bass Lake, our Chalets provide the comfort and charm of a private mountain cabin.

Available every day of the year, our two-story Chalets contain a fully-equipped all-electric kitchen, living room and queen sized hide-a-bed upstairs. All Chalets have cable television, linens, cookware and dishes, and some have fireplaces.

Downstairs has a full bath with shower and a bedroom with one king or two queen sized beds. In addition, each Chalet has a private deck with picnic table and small barbecue.

Adjacent to the Chalets is The Pines Tennis Club, which features a meeting room, tennis courts and a spa tub.



### SUITES

## SIGHTSEEING



### BASS LAKE QUEEN II

Board the Bass Lake Queen II from The Pines Resort and take a leisurely one-hour narrated cruise April through October. Groups can charter the 50-seat boat for a private sunset or moonlight cruise on Bass Lake.

### FRESNO FLATS HISTORICAL PARK

This Oakhurst history park contains furnished original buildings dating back to the late 1800s. It is open daily for self-guided tours from dawn to dusk; guided tours are available by appointment. For information, call (559) 683-6570.

### BASS LAKE BALD EAGLES

Visitors to Bass Lake can spend an afternoon watching a family of American Bald Eagles that have taken up residence across the lake from The Pines Resort. A mature eagle couple has called Bass Lake home since 1998 and has successfully raised offspring from their nest. The beautiful birds frequently

soar above the lake, and the best vantage point for viewing is from Ducey's Bar & Grill.



### SCENIC BYWAY

The Sierra Vista National Scenic Byway meanders 100 miles through the Sierra Nevada above Bass Lake. There are great reasons to stop along the way, including the spectacular views along a gentle half-mile hike to Fresno Dome. Another highlight of the Byway is the Nelder Grove Giant Sequoia Preservation Area, home to "Bull Buck," one of the largest and oldest trees in the world. Maps of the Byway are available at The Pines Resort registration desk.

### SIERRA MONO MUSEUM

The Sierra Mono Museum at nearby North Fork offers visitors one of the finest displays of Native American artifacts to be found in the region. The museum houses a remarkable collection of Native American artifacts, which are the heirloom possessions of many families in the area. For information, call (559) 877-2115.

### YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK

This natural wonder is a must-see on any visit to the region - the southern entrance to Yosemite National Park is only 14 miles from Bass Lake.

Winter activities include downhill and cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, snowboarding and ice skating. Spring, summer and fall activities include hiking, horseback riding, river rafting, bicycling and mountain climbing. A variety of sightseeing tours offer expert guides and the chance to see spectacular landmarks such as Half Dome, El Capitan, Yosemite Falls, Glacier Point, Tunnelview, Mariposa Grove, Wawona History Center and much more. ### YOSEMITE MOUNTAIN SUGAR PINE RAILROAD

Treat yourself to some of the Sierra National Forest's magnificent scenery while riding in log cars pulled by an historic steam engine. Open-air seating provides an excellent view of the surroundings as the train puffs

**FISHING**

Bass Lake is heartily stocked annually with bass, trout, and Kokanee salmon. The fishing experts at The Pines Market can provide you with everything needed for a successful fishing venture, from a full set of tackle and bait to up-to-date tips about where the fish are biting. A California State fishing license is required and is available at The Pines Market.

**GOLF**

**Sierra Meadows Ranch Course** is an 18-hole championship course carved through a valley of large oaks, lakes and meadows. It's located only 15 miles from The Pines Resort. For information, call (559) 642-1343.



**Sierra Meadows at River Creek** is only 15 miles from The Pines Resort. This nine-hole course, guarded by beautiful oaks and towering pines, is beautiful and challenging. For information, call (559) 683-3388.

**HIKING TRAILS**

*Goat Mountain Lookout Trail*

The trail to the Goat Mountain Fire Lookout travels four miles up, presenting several vistas of Bass Lake and the beautiful forest and wildlife of the Sierra Nevada. The trail has two trailheads, one in the Forks Campground and the other at the entrance of Spring Cove Campground.

*Way of the Mono*

This enjoyable half-mile walk takes hikers into the past to learn about the “first campers” in the area, the Native American Western Mono. The exceptionally maintained self-guided trail travels through a variety of vegetation, and explains how the hunting and gathering Mono lived in harmony with the land.

**HORSEBACK RIDING**

Located in Fish Camp, the Yosemite Trails Pack Station is open daily all summer (mid-June through Labor Day weekend). They offer attentive, scenic rides for small groups. The horses are gentle and well-kept. Rides can be one hour in duration, or you may choose a 1/2 day ride. Take a picnic lunch for this excursion into the Giant Sequoias. ## GETTING TO THE PINES RESORT

### FROM OAKHURST

Go through the town of Oakhurst 3.5 miles to the Bass Lake turnoff (Road 222), turn right and travel 4 miles to Road 274, then 2 miles to The Pines Resort.

### FROM FRESNO

Take Highway 41 north 50 miles to Oakhurst.

### FROM BAKERSFIELD

Take Highway 99 north 117 miles to Fresno, then take Highway 41 north 50 miles to Oakhurst.

### FROM SAN JOSE

Take I-101 south to Highway 152 east at Gilroy, to Highway 99 south to Madera, then take the Highway 145 "Yosemite exit" east to Highway 41 and go north to Oakhurst.

### FROM SACRAMENTO, STOCKTON OR MODESTO

Take Highway 99 south to Merced, then take Highway 140 east to Mariposa, then take Highway 49 south to Oakhurst.

### FROM MERCED

Take Highway 140 to Mariposa, then take Highway 49 south to Oakhurst.

### FROM OAKLAND AND THE BAY AREA

Take I-580 east to I-5 south, then take Highway 132 east to Highway 99 south to Merced.

### FROM LOS ANGELES

Take I-5 north to Highway 99 north to Bakersfield.

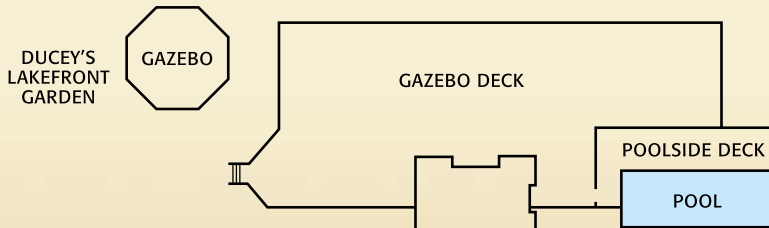
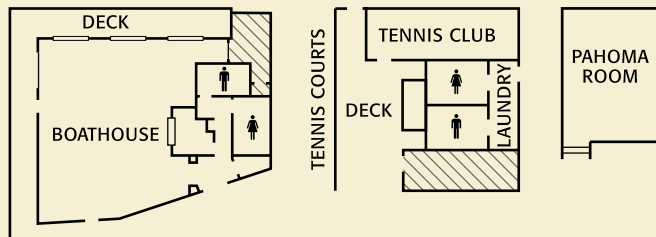
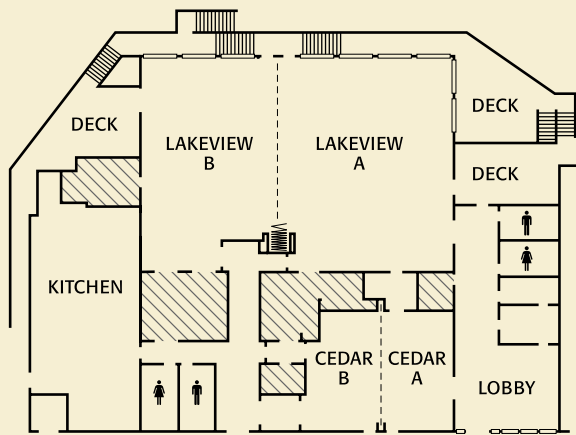
